Why is Youth Engagement in Public Benefits Access Important?

- Youth are often cultural brokers for their family and help navigate public benefits and supports
- Involving youth in public benefits access educates them about the resources available to them and their families, increasing word of mouth and overall awareness of public benefits in the community
- Youth can help identify or address barriers to accessing public benefits - such as, communication, stigma, and other hurdles

Youth Engagement Ladder: Low Tier

- 1. Manipulation: Adults use young people to support their own projects and pretend they are the result of young people's inspiration
- 2. Decoration: young people are used to help implement adults' initiatives
- 3. Tokenism: participation for show young people have little or no influence on their activities



Youth Engagement Ladder: Mid Tier

- 4. Youth Informed: Young people are assigned tasks and informed how and why they are involved in the project
- 5. Youth Consulted: Adults make decisions, while young people are consulted and informed



Youth Engagement Ladder: High Tier

- **6. Youth and Adult Equality:** Adults' initiative, with joint decisions
- 7. Youth Driven: Young people's initiative and leadership
- 8. Youth and Adult Equity: Young people's initiative, decisions made in partnership with adults





Building Blocks of Youth Engagement

- **1. Ask Them:** How do they want to be involved? What is their capacity and interest?
- 2. Appreciate youth and their perspective: How are their perspectives different, and how can they improve your project?
- 3. Be genuinely inclusive: How can you avoid tokenism and make sure students are heard and engaged through each part of the process?
- **4. Be responsive:** Respond quickly and use relevant platforms to communicate regularly
