- Located in the Mojave high desert of Southern California.
- Comprised of 17 schools.
- 8,481 students enrolled.
- Dedicated to providing nutritious food choices that are tasty and appealing to all students.







Tina Byrd District Child Nutrition Director, Jasper School District, Arkansas

Jasper School District, Arkansas

- One of the state's largest school districts, covering Newton, Johnson, Madison, Franklin, and Carroll Counties.
- Made up of three campuses: Jasper, Kingston and Oark.
- Delivered meals to students' homes when schools shut down in 2020, with almost twelve hundred miles covered for three campuses.
- Other waivers resulted in home meal delivery service to an additional 600 children.
- Home deliveries to children continue through the SSO and other waivers in five Arkansas counties.







Anna Lusk, MPH, Child Nutrition Director, Henry County Public Schools, Kentucky

Henry County Public Schools, Kentucky

- A small rural district including 5 schools with approximately 1900 students enrolled.
- Offer School Breakfast Program (second chance breakfast), National School Lunch Program (SSO 21-22), Summer Food Service Program (2021 was first summer operating SFSP).
- Breakfast participation: 62%
- Lunch participation: 78%
