## **Quick Facts on Immigrant Families in the United States**



Today, 1 in 4 children in the United States live in families that include at least one immigrant parent.



Of the over 17 million children with immigrant parents, the overwhelming majority (87%) are U.S. citizens. ii



Immigrants paid over \$500 billion in taxes and generated \$1.4 trillion in spending power in 2021.<sup>iii</sup>



In the wake of public charge, 2.1 million immigrant essential workers and household members likely forwent Medicaid and 1.3 million forwent Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits.<sup>iv</sup>



In the wake of public charge, 3-4 million children in immigrant families missed out on public benefits they were eligible for that could have addressed hunger in 2022.
