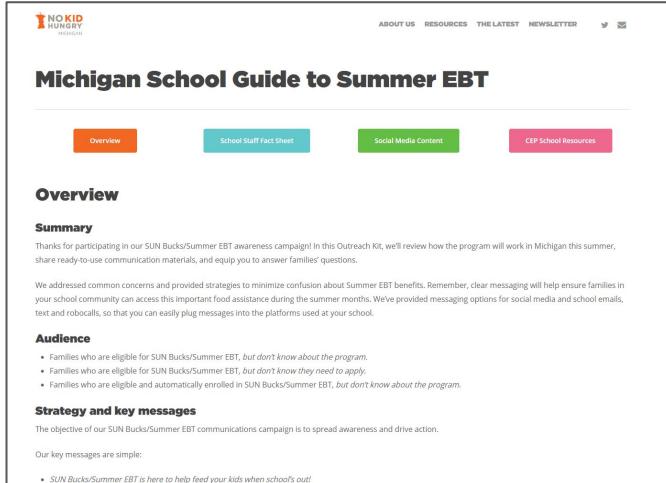

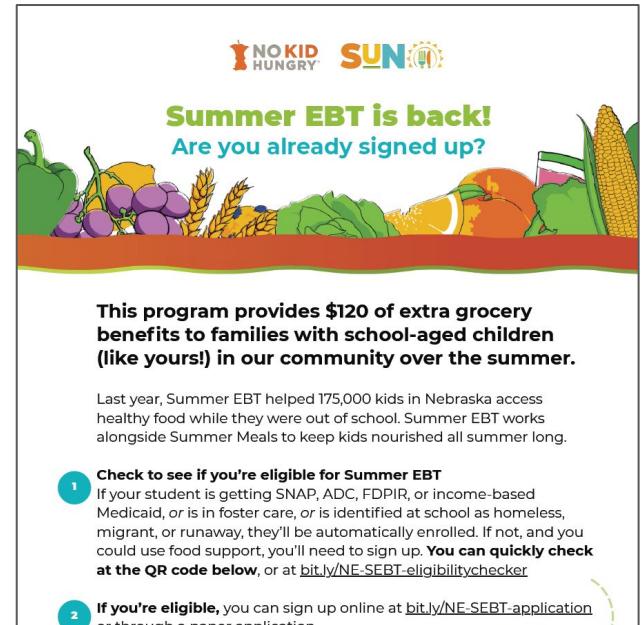

Opportunity to reduce burden on schools

“Feels like we got less questions this summer [from families] on what they needed to do. This year compared to last year, it was night and day difference. We are headed in the right direction.”

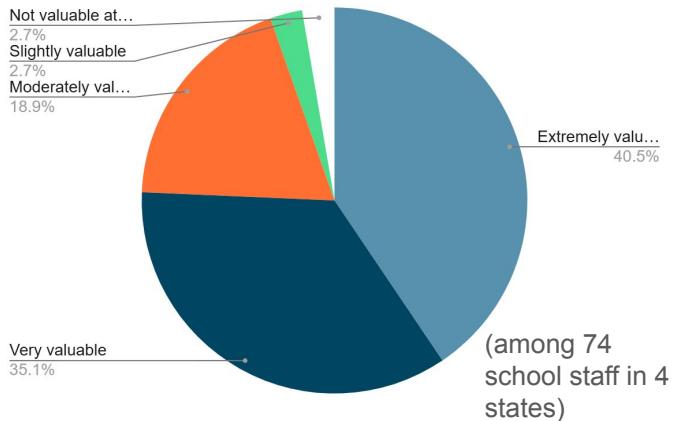

How valuable do you think it is for schools to actively communicate with families about Summer EBT/ SUN Bucks?

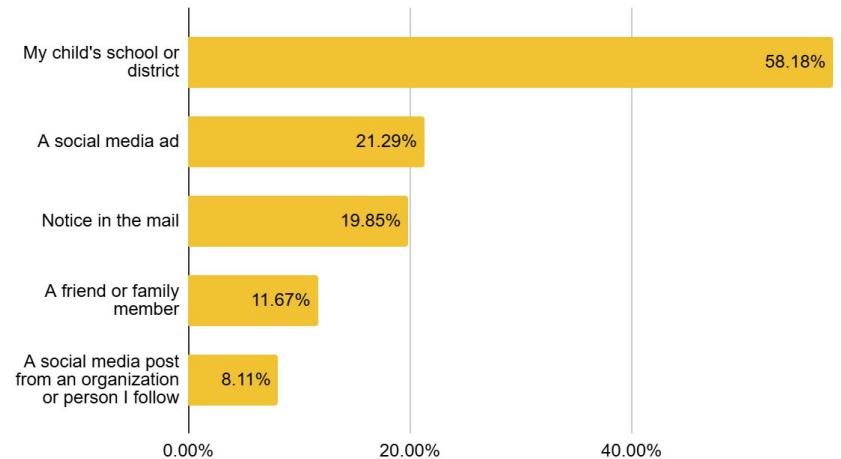

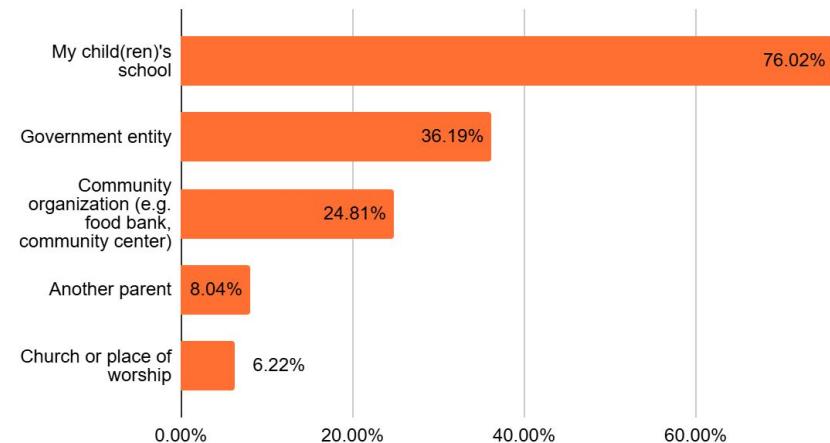

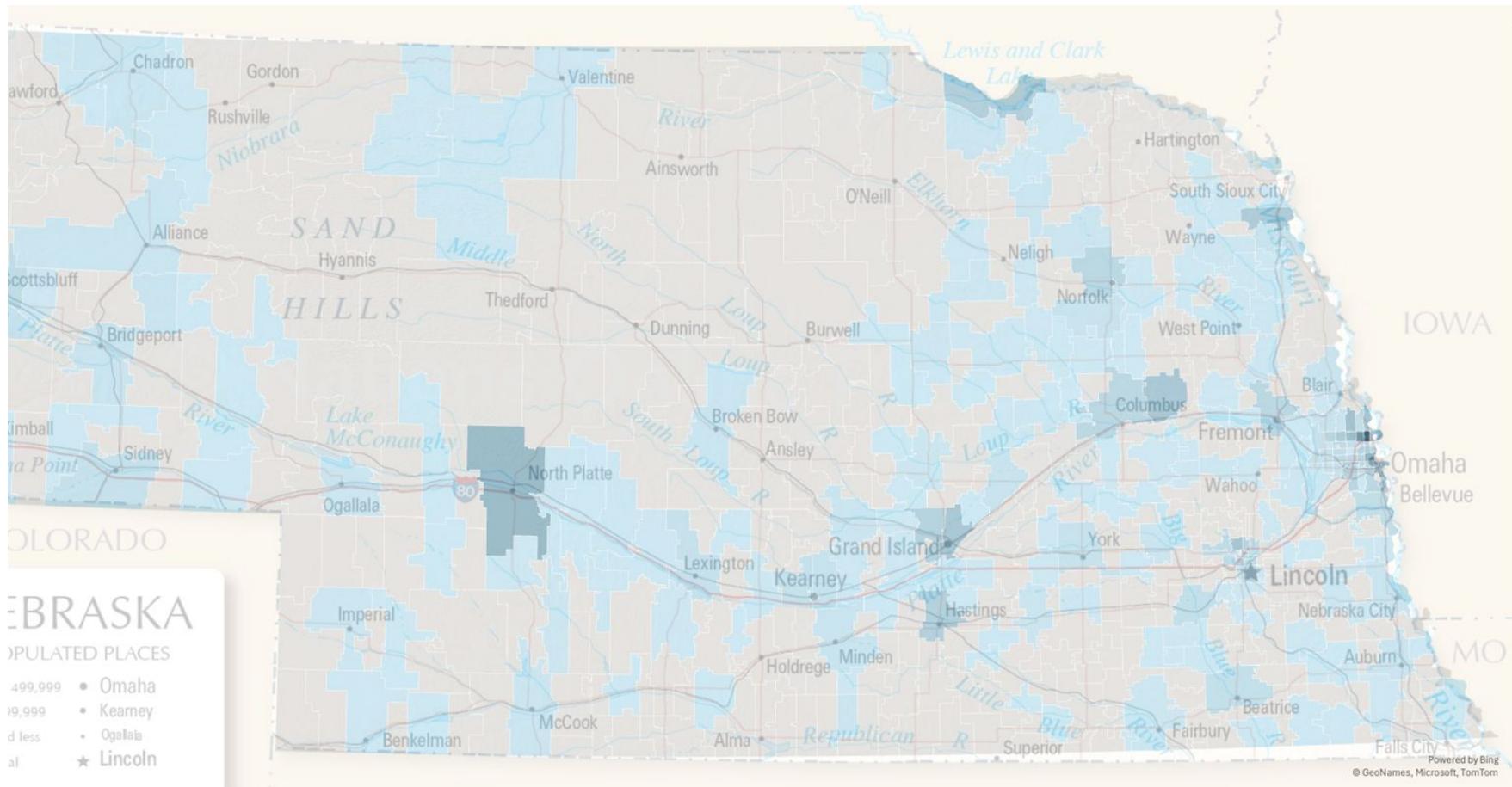

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Nebraska Summer EBT

- Department of Health & Human Services + Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) launched and co-administer SEBT
- NDE provides training & communication templates to school staff/data stewards
 - 350 school districts (LEAs), 900 sites
- 360,000 students enrolled in Nebraska schools
 - 180,000 F/R eligible (79,332 CEP students)
- 199,000 children received SEBT in 2025
 - 157,000 streamline certified (credit to Direct Certification system)
 - 3,140 by SEBT application (7,857 submitted apps)
 - Remaining from F/R meals approved through school meals benefit application

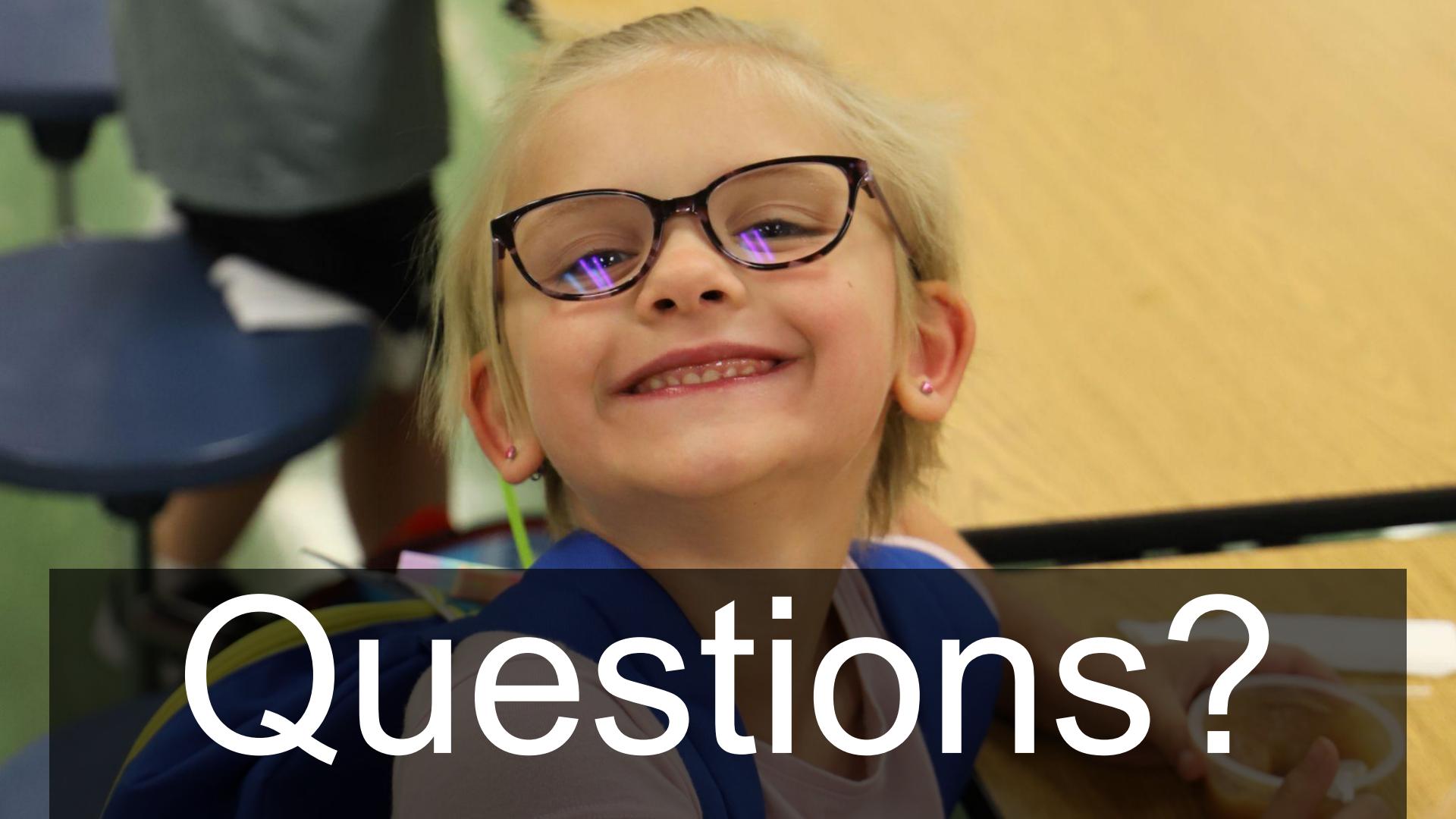

CORE PRINCIPLES

In this section, we discuss the value of partnering with schools to spread the word about Summer EBT, as well as specific strategies for doing so. This is based directly on our efforts partnering with states and learning from school and agency experiences in summers 2024 and 2025. This section relies on the following core principles for engaging and partnering with schools—principles that are equally relevant for collaborating with other partners:

- **Reduce the burden on schools:** When asking others to help share information about Summer EBT, make it the lightest lift possible for them. This means having ready-to-use, state-specific resources available for anyone interested in conducting outreach or fielding questions. In addition, ensure customer service center staff have appropriate training and protocols needed to resolve inquiries without directing families back to schools.
- **Ensure access to accurate information:** Ensure resources point towards accurate and actionable program information. This means [accessible, clear information](#) is available on the agency website and tools such as [eligibility checkers](#) are used to guide families through the program.
- **Leverage the school calendar:** Rely on the cadence of the school calendar and



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Summer EBT guide for partners

SUMMER EBT IS BACK!

Summer EBT provides \$120 in extra grocery benefits for each eligible child over the summer. It's just one way to make sure that kids in our community have access to the healthy food they usually get at school.

Most eligible children are automatically enrolled in the program, so some will need to apply.

Trusted community members (like you!) can help spread the word about **Summer EBT**. This partnership is crucial to ensuring no child goes hungry during summer break. Help families in your community understand, apply for, and use **Summer EBT** support by sharing information about this program.

Sign up for \$120 in extra grocery support over the summer! Visit [summerebt.org/states/YOUR STATE](#) to see if you're automatically enrolled or if you need to apply.

End of School Messaging THE LAST MONTH OF SCHOOL

When school is out, Summer EBT is in! Summer EBT benefits are loaded onto your existing card or mailed to your address. If you haven't received Summer EBT, you can still apply.

Over the Summer Messaging A MONTH BEFORE DEADLINE

Don't miss out on Summer EBT support! If you haven't received Summer EBT yet, there's still time! The deadline to apply is **DATE**.

Back to School Messaging WHEN STUDENTS RETURN

Are your Summer EBT benefits still on the shelf? Be sure to use them before they expire after 4 months.
