



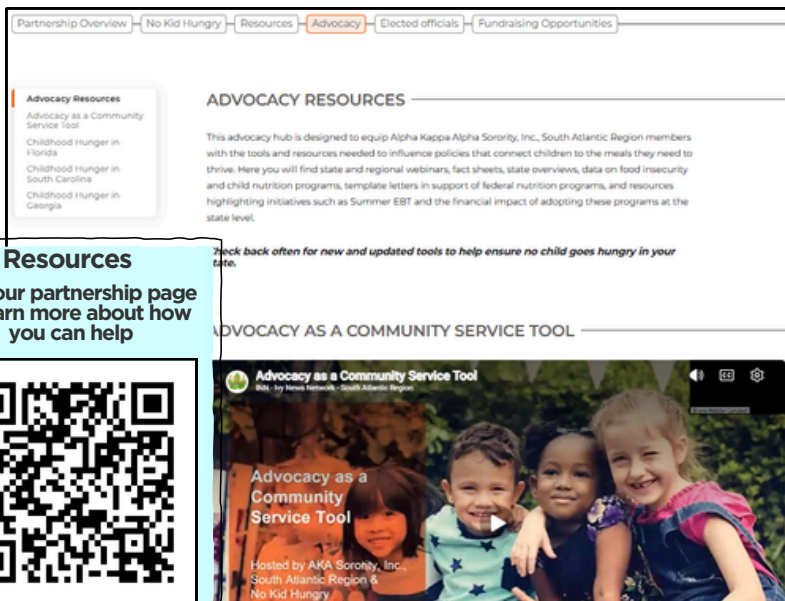

Florida

In Florida, one in five children faces food insecurity. During Florida AKA Day at the Capitol, No Kid Hungry Director Sky Beard joined AKA leaders and legislators to highlight the need for expanded access to food. She also supported the “Longest Table” event in Gadsden County, where approximately fifty families gathered with community leaders for a shared meal and conversation, bringing greater awareness to the issue of childhood food insecurity.

Georgia

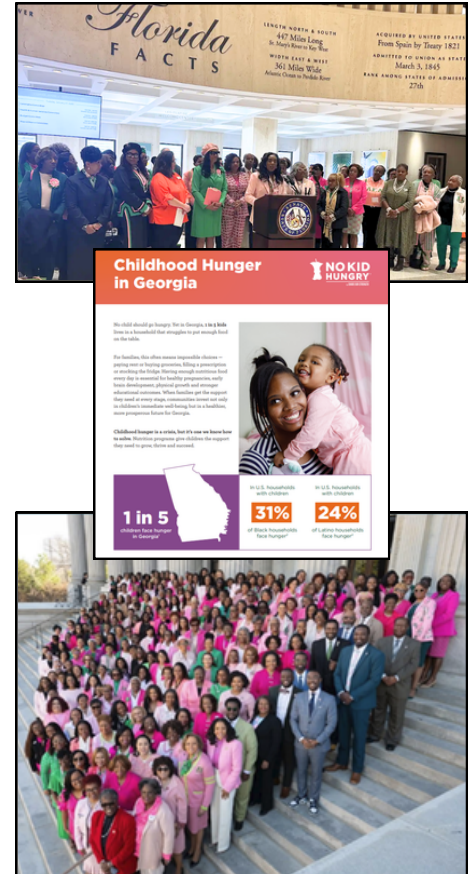
On March 1, No Kid Hungry partnered with GA Day at the Capitol co-chairs to host a statewide webinar attended by over 200 AKA members. *Service in Action: Moving Policy for Georgia’s Children* explored childhood hunger in Georgia, the role of advocacy, and tools to influence policy.

South Carolina

More than one in six children in South Carolina lives in a food-insecure household. During SC AKA Day at the Capitol, No Kid Hungry supported a letter-writing campaign advocating for the SUN Bucks Program (i.e., Summer EBT). Adopting SUN Bucks in SC could bring an estimated \$114 million in federal funding into South Carolina’s local economies while helping families afford groceries.

- **Connect with decision-makers** to push for policies that help kids thrive.
