

EQUIPMENT LIST FOR MEAL SERVICE SY21-22

Given the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, meal service during the 2021-2022 school year may continue to look different than it has in the past. This list has been updated to include equipment to help you provide meals to students wherever they'll be eating this school year- in the cafeteria, the classroom or at home.

For equipment funding suggestions, please consider talking with colleagues, state agencies, SNA, National Dairy Council, USDA, and No Kid Hungry.

Please note that the equipment options included on this list are not product recommendations. Check your district's procurement process and then identify the best items that meet regulations and that fit for your needs.

Depending on which state you are in, some items may or may not be relevant depending on school/district reopening status.

Items Purchased During the Pandemic

- Sealers can still be used to package meals or to individually wrap fruits and vegetables for serving via a la carte for delivery, in the cafeteria, and in the classroom
- Breakfast carts can still be used for Breakfast After the Bell, lunch or a la carte and other Grab & Go meals
- Refrigerators/Freezers food storage space is welcomed and needed for all perishable foods



REPURPOSING & REUSING ITEMS

What schools may already have: carts, coolers, salad bars, bun racks, shelves with casters, dollies, refrigerators, storage spaces, and catering equipment.

How can you repurpose these items? Below are some innovative ideas/solutions that school nutrition leaders nationwide have shared:

- Breakfast carts: Carts can be used to deliver meals (both breakfast and lunch) to the classroom. Also, casters (cart wheels) can be added to shelving to help deliver meals. Bun pan/bread racks can be used as needed for food delivery. Kitchen carts can also be used to deliver meals. Feeling creative? Decorating kitchen carts with poster paper can improve presentation.
- Containers: utilize existing containers in storage.
 - Rolling ice caddies can be used to roll meals out, or as mobile milk boxes.
 - Salad bars can be used as storage for milk and cold food items as well as for delivery.
 - Milk dollies can be used to transport items to the classroom.
 - Ice cream freezers can be used to keep milk cold.

EQUIPMENT EXAMPLES

The examples below are not product recommendations. Please check with your procurement process to research the best equipment for your needs.

Grab & Go/Carts and Kiosks

For meal delivery throughout campus and Grab & Go



GRAB & GO CARTS

This is a type of Grab & Go breakfast cart. Colorful bins are used to hold meal components.

Example: <u>Hubert</u> \$1,200-\$1,500



FLEX STATION

This cart can be used for Grab & Go stations. This unit is flexible depending on the need, can use trays or bins to set up for meal service and serve many students in narrow hallways.

FOLDING GRAB & GO CART

These carts are easy to relocate and can fold up to fit in a 2' X 2' space.

GRAB & GO CART

Can accommodate 3 full size food pans within its well; no built-in ice bin or heat source.

GRAB & GO CART

Customizable snack kiosk with built-in insulated ice bin with drain.

Equipment for Food Transport

This equipment can help transport meals to the classroom, or other meal service locations, as well as for home delivery



THERMAL BAG

These come in multiple sizes. Higher priced ones are typically better quality, last longer, and keep better temperature.

MEAL TRANSPORT BIN WITH LID

This item is used for shelf stable storage and delivery.

Example: Orbis

EXAMPLE CART/BAG SET UP

This set up is commonly used for delivering meals to the classroom. Hot and cold items are stored separately. Note this is THREE SEPARATE PIECES when you purchase. Estimated amount is for all THREE pieces.

Packaging Items

These can be helpful in packaging meals or for delivery and for packaging a la carte



PACKAGING MACHINE

Manually operated, sealing 6-8 packages per minute (can buy or lease), if lease must buy containers.

Example: Oliver sealer

PACKAGING MEALS

Trays, film and sealing equipment.

Example: Form Plastics

Pricing may start around \$2475, contact vendor for pricing.



FOOD PACKAGING

Bags designed to withstand hot and cold temperatures, Techni-ice to keep products cold or hot, and heavy-duty tape sealers.

Example: **Ekonopac**

Prices vary depending on items chosen, contact

vendor for pricing





BAG SEALING TAPE MACHINE

Used to seal bags to keep items fresh.

Example: Innoseal

Rolling Carts

For meal delivery to classrooms or other areas on school campus



ROLLING CART

Dimensions (LWxH) 45x25x33", load capacity 500lbs. Weighs 43 lbs.

Black Steel 2-tier stocking cart 41.5 x18x41". Load capacity 800 lbs.

HAND TRUCK

Has many uses including transport of meals to alternative service areas.

LARGE 4-SHELF ROLLING CART

In addition to kitchen shelving, these carts can be used to transport thermal bags and trays to hallways and classrooms.

Cart can also be used to set up Grab & Go station baskets and crates.

MILK DOLLY

Used to transport boxes of heavy and bulky products to meal serving areas.

BASKET SHELVES

May be able to convert existing shelving units.

SHEET PAN RACKS

Sheet pan racks can be used to deliver meals to the classroom/other areas.

Refrigerators, Ice Makers & Freezers



REFRIGERATOR

Example: Webstaraunt

\$2,000-\$4,000 depending on size \$2,200 for a 1-door \$3,200 for a 2-door



ICE MAKER

Great for serving and transporting cold items as well as for catering uses.

Example: <u>CKitchen</u>

Cost: \$1,800-\$3,600



FREEZER

Example: Webstaraunt

\$2,500-\$4,500 \$2,800 for a 1-door \$4,000 for a 2-door



Storage Serving Options



MILK COOLER

Milk coolers are typically use on the serving line, however if additional milk storage or cold transport is needed, milk coolers can be used. Available to accommodate 12 or 16 milk rates, depending on need.

REFRIGERATED AIR SCREENS

To keep items cool as they're on display, like drinks and prepackaged meals and snacks.

HOT/COLD MOBILE CABINETS

Cold mobile cabinets. Prices vary depending on size and quality. Contact local equipment representative for options.

Bottle Refill Stations

LARGE BEVERAGE CONTAINERS

Can be used for water and other beverages

Work with your school or district's IT department to determine what is the best solution for your school.

SOFTWARE LICENSES

Schools usually add a license to their already existing software that they are using for school meals. If they are selecting a new software for their meal programs, they typically work with a specification list of their needs and their IT department to select potential vendors for providing the solutions that they need to operate and claim meals.

Online Ordering



There are many meal ordering applications out there (<u>Choosi</u>, <u>Linq</u>, <u>Meal Magic</u>, and <u>LunchApp</u> are a few that are being mentioned).

Some meal ordering modules may work independently of meal software. You may want to check with your accountability software to see if there are online ordering modules that you can access.

SMOOTHIE MACHINES

Commercial grade, small blender- used for breakfast smoothies.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Includes handwashing and sanitization stations which may or may not be needed based on district requirements



HAND SANITATION STATIONS

Sanitizer Stands (stationary or mobile)

Example: Amazon

DISINFECTING WIPES STAND

Floor stand with sign holder, wipes and trash can holder.

SAFETY SHIELDS

Counter safety shields (clear shower liner may also be considered as hanging partition).

Example: **Hubert**

SOCIAL DISTANCING SIGNAGE

Customizable social distancing signage and more. Some districts are using tape and/or cones and varies markings on tables and floors to ensure students stay safely distanced while in line for meals or sitting and eating.

CAFETERIA & CLASSROOM SAFETY

You can purchase tables with safety dividers or see if your tables can be retrofitted with safety dividers.




CLASSROOM SORTING BIN

Recommended that schools/classrooms only receive these bins if they are required and trained to sort trash.

1 GALLON LEFTOVER MILK COLLECTION JUG

This is used to collect leftover milk to keep it from filling the garbage cans or collecting in classroom sink drains.
