Five things to know about the new Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefit for families

What is P-EBT?

P-EBT is a new federal nutrition program that provides a small grocery benefit for families to **purchase food**. P-EBT was first available in 2020 for families with school-aged children, and was extended in 2021 to include some families with young children as well.

How much is the P-EBT benefit?

Each eligible child receives \$6.82 for each school day in which in-person learning was impacted due to the pandemic during the 2020-2021 school year. The total benefit will vary with a maximum benefit of **about \$34 per child**, **per week**. P-EBT benefits will also be available for the summer of 2021 and will average **\$375 per child** for the full summer break.

Who qualifies for P-EBT?

P-EBT is for students who qualify for free or reduced-priced school meals, including all students attending schools that offer meals at no cost with the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). A student must also be learning in a virtual or hybrid model due to pandemic-related school closures or schedule changes. In the 2020-2021 school year, most children under the age of six in families participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) are also eligible for P-EBT benefits if nearby schools are virtual or hybrid.

How do families receive P-EBT benefits?



Most eligible children receive P-EBT benefits **automatically**. Children in families with SNAP usually receive P-EBT benefits on their existing EBT card. In most states, students enrolled in the free and reduced-price school meal program (but not receiving SNAP) automatically receive a P-EBT card in the mail, based on the address on file with their school. However, please note that each state has a different plan for operating P-EBT and for distributing benefits.

Do families need to apply for P-EBT benefits?



While P-EBT benefits are automatically provided to most eligible children, it is important for families with school-aged children to **complete a school meal benefit application** for this school year (especially Kindergarten and transfer students) and to **make sure the school has the correct mailing address on file.**

Remember Students and children eligible for P-EBT can also still pick up summer meals. Text "FOOD" or "COMIDA" to 304-304 to find a location near you.
